THE STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS FOR FY 2024/25

1.0 Preamble

On behalf of Lira City and on my behalf, I welcome you to this Council meeting and hereby present The State of the City Address for FY 2024/25.

The LGA Sec 24(f), Rule 10 (1) of the Standard Rule of Procedure 2019 mandates the Mayor to deliver the State of the City Address at the beginning of every financial year and as mandated, I hereby address you as follows;

1.1 Summary of Budget Releases

Mr. Speaker, during FY 2023/24, this Council received a total of 52,516,237,000 out of the budget of 55,010,927,000, contributing to 95.5% of the planned target which included supplementary releases as summarized on table1.

Likewise, the City locally raised a total of 4,221,570,700 by the end of quarter four contributing to 89.8% of the annual target of 4,700,000,000. This was below the target because of revenue arrears which was not collected 100%. The Council intends to contract a debt collector to collect the revenue arrears in the current financial year.

Similarly, in FY 2024-25, the Council Budget is estimated at 43,984,543,535 of which 6,400,000,000 will be raised locally. The key priorities in this budget includes the following; Procurement of a Motor Grader using Locally Raised Revenue, recruitment of Heads of Departments and other critical positions upon clearance by Ministry of Public Service and Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, completion and operationalization of USMID constructed facilities, investments in Education and Health, as well as continued implementation of PDM among others.

Mr. Speaker, allow me to inform this Council that the process for preparation of National Development Plan IV and City Development Plan for FY 2025/25-2030/31 has started with the major focus on the orientation of Leaders on the NDPIV strategic direction and the 10-fold growth strategy. This process will be participatory and is expected to be completed and approved by May 2025.

2.0 Departmental Performances

2.1 Roads and Engineering Department:

During Q4, Roads and Engineering department received a cumulative total of 14,062,143,000 out of the budget of 17,418,417,000 contributing to 80.7% of the revised annual budget. This was below the annual target of 100% because of local revenue was released at only 8%. The overall expenditure stands at 98%.

2.1.1 Implemented Activities for FY 2023/24 under Transport Rehabilitation Grant (TRG)

A total of 14 roads (35km) were rehabilitated at 859,086,900. The major interventions on these roads included; Bush Clearing, Scarifying, gravelling and Drainage works as detailed in table 3 below:

2.3 Progress of USMID Project Implementation, FY 2019/20-2024/25

The analysis done by the USMID Project Implementation Team and Planning Department shows that, a cumulative total of 37,335,314,653 has so far been released by the end of Quarter 1 of FY 2024/25. Out of this, 31,713,491,056 has already been utilized, while a total of 5,169,724,367 is not yet utilized. This will be used on the following projects; completion of the ongoing projects including retention which will cost 2,653,000,000, additional works at Coronation Park, Children's Park and Mayors Garden costing 552,890,177. Likewise, the contribution from Government of Uganda in form of co funding estimated at 1,954,590,724 will be utilized on completion and operationalization of projects as detailed in table 4.1 & 4.2 below.

2.4 Summary of Transport Rehabilitation Grant (TRG) Projects, FY 2024-25

Due to poor conditions of our roads as evidenced in the parish needs assessment report of 2022/23, Ministry of Works has earmarked a total of 1b. UGx. to rehabilitate roads in each LG/City. The City has planned to rehabilitate about 43km of roads with the major interventions comprising of grading, full gravelling, and drainage works. In addition, the cost benefit analysis conducted by our Engineering Team, revealed that by adopting renting of borrow pit as a source of marram, the cost of gravelling a kilometer of road will reduce from 35 million to 20 million. Therefore, the costing of graveling a Km of road will be 20m as compared to 35m from the usual supply approach. The following projects were there considered under TRG as detailed in table 4.3 below.

2.4 Challenges under Works Department.

- Delays of funds releases
- Delays in implementation of roads planned under URF and TRG
- Un clear terms about time base and admeasures contracts
- Lack of Complete Set of Roads equipment
- Indiscriminate disposal of garbage in the side drains
- Reduction in URF from 1b to 300m
- High cost of hiring of Road Equipment
- Low staffing level
- Delays in implementing works by the contractor (USMID)

For future improvement, these are the lessons learnt;

• Timely Preparations of B.O.Qs for all roads

- Updating roads inventory in time
- Create awareness to the community on the importance of roads, water pipes, electricity etc.
- Timely preparations and approval of the project designs by the MDAs
- Recruitment of staff

3.0 Analysis of health Sector Performance in FY 2023-24

By the end of Quarter 4, Health Department had received a cumulative total of 4,505,842,000 out of the revised budget of 5,381,201,000 contributing to 87.3% of the revised budget. this was below the quarterly target of 100% because of low release of local revenues to the department. Cumulatively, the department received a total of 17,638,511,000 out of the revised budget of 18,600,800,000 contributing to 94.8% of the revised budget. This was below the 100% performance target because local revenue was released at only 49%. All funds were utilized as per the plan.
